FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Holy Angels Family,

Well, it's hard to believe that this is my last week here as your pastor. I arrived here on Wednesday, February 11, 2015, and I remember having a warm welcome. Then it snowed the next weekend and the rest of February saw the Potomac freeze over. As I look back, how very grateful I am for my time here! When I arrived, I knew next to nothing about the 7th District or St. Clement's Island or tobacco farming or being a waterman. But now that history is a part of me. When I arrived, I didn't know much about scalded oysters, oyster stew, stuffed ham, soft shell crabs, trotlines, 10 oz cans, lawn mower races, church dinners, volunteer fire departments and rescue squads (and auxiliaries), the Blessing of the Fleet, Old Gum, the Optimist Club, St. Clement's Hundred, Quade's Store, Anderson Bar, Potomac Gardens, Abell's diner, turkey shoots, or any of the other things that make this community unique. But now I will carry this community with me where ever I go. When I arrived, I knew very little about being a pastor in charge of not just one but two parishes. But now, the heart of a shepherd is growing more within me. When I arrived, I didn't know you. And that has been the best part about being here. Getting to know you, and seeing how much Jesus Christ loves you, and how much He is working in you, is being faithful to you, is rejoicing with you and is weeping with you.

I thank God at this moment for the privilege and honor and blessing of being your spiritual father. At least, that is what God has wanted me to be. I ask your forgiveness for my failings and sins that squandered the gifts God has wanted to bestow on you. I only hope I have learned from them. Thank you for opening your homes and hearts to me. I truly feel like I am a part of your family. And I am a better priest because of you and your prayers. Though I will be departing,

Jesus, who has been a part of this community from the very beginning, will remain. And He will shine through your new pastor, blessing you in ways you cannot now imagine.
